



The following will be covered: gaps in the revenue cycle that lead to denials, underpayments, and patient dissatisfaction, as well as places of service, documentation, orders, and charges.

#### Certified Phlebotomy Technician - 1



**OVERVIEW:** Phlebotomists are professionals who draw blood for tests, transfusions, donations, or research. This program provides clinical instruction, training and knowledge to apply and take the National Certification Phlebotomy Technician 1 exam. Lectures cover laboratory environment, anatomy, safety and infection control, equipment, and the phlebotomy procedure.

**EXTERNSHIP:** Clinical instruction provides hands-on training in venipuncture technique, laboratory assisting, and administrative office duties.

**JOB OUTLOOK:** The need for Phlebotomists will remain high as doctors and other health-care professionals require blood work for analysis and diagnoses. According to U.S. Department of Labor Statistics, the national demand of phlebotomy technicians is forecast to grow by an estimated 24% by 2026.

**COMPLETION AND CERTIFICATION:** Students can complete the program in approximately 4 to 6 months. Upon completion, the student will qualify to apply to the State of California as a Certified Phlebotomy Technician 1 (CPT1).

#### **DIRECTIONS**TO WEST LOS ANGELES COLLEGE

Most Westside Extension classes are held at West Los Angeles College, located at Overland Ave and Freshman Drive, two lights south of Jefferson Blvd., in Culver City. The street address is 9000 Overland Ave. A second convenient entrance is at 10100 Jefferson west of LaCienega.

**From La Cienega** Turn west on to Obama Blvd. Obama becomes Jefferson Blvd. Then, turn left on College Blvd., which brings you to the campus.

From Westchester, the Airport area & the South Bay Take the San Diego (405) Freeway north. Exit at Jefferson Blvd. Turn right onto Jefferson, and proceed straight, crossing Sepulveda. The street name will change to Playa, and when it curves north about 1/4 mile farther, Playa becomes Overland Ave. Proceed north on Overland past two stop signs. The next light is Freshman Drive. Turn right, onto the campus.

From West Los Angeles, Santa Monica & the San Fernando Valley Take the San Diego (405) Freeway south. Exit at Jefferson Blvd. Turn left onto Jefferson, and proceed straight, crossing Sepulveda. The street name will change to Playa, and when it curves north about 1/4 mile farther, Playa becomes Overland Ave. Proceed north on Overland past two stop signs. The next light is Freshman Dr. Turn right, onto the campus.

From Downtown Los Angeles Take the Santa Monica (10) Freeway west. Exit at Overland Ave. Turn left, and proceed south on Overland about 2.5 miles. Continue past Jefferson Blvd. and make a left turn at the second signal, Freshman Drive.

From Ladera Heights & Inglewood Take Slauson west to Hannum (by Fox Hills Mall, 1 block east of Sepulveda) and turn right. Make a right at Playa. Playa curves north and becomes Overland Ave. Proceed north on Overland past two stop signs. The next light is Freshman Drive. Turn right, onto the campus.

#### **GETTING TO OUR OFFICE**


Our office is located in the Fine Arts Building, Room 202. Parking is available in the 1,000-car Parking Structure directly across from the Fine Arts building. If you park, even temporarily, in the regular student parking spaces without a permit—you may be ticketed.

#### STUDENT PARKING

Westside Extension Student parking is available in the Parking Structure and overflow lot 8A, Lot 7, and Lot 4A near the PEC Complex. You must display a valid West L.A. College parking permit. Parking is enforced 7 days a week. You may buy a daily parking permit for \$2 from permit dispensing machines (use one dollar bills or quarters only) located in each parking lot. 


